

Insect and Disease Update:

Margaret Pickoff, Horticulture Educator Penn State Extension Bucks County

Ms. Pickoff is a Horticulture Educator. She holds a Master of Science degree in Plant, Soil, and Environmental Sciences from the University of Maine.

Ms. Pickoff will give a review of major insect pests and plant diseases observed in the Pennsylvania landscape in the 2025 season, based on Penn State diagnostic laboratory data and firsthand observation. She will conclude with a discussion of new and emerging issues, including beech leaf disease and box tree moth.

Treating Diseases/Pest Focus on Box Tree Moth:

Kevin Chase

Mr. Kevin Chase conducts entomological research on a variety of tree and shrub insect pests across North America, the United Kingdom and Ireland. Some of the major insect groups Kevin works with are scale insects, invasive caterpillars, bark beetles and wood boring insects. Kevin is also involved in trailing (training?) biological control agents and safer products for both human applicators and non-target insects.

Based in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, Kevin's appplied research focuses on integrated pest management of ornamental pests on the urban landscape. He researches how biological control can be used in plant health care programs as well as how to manage new invasive insect pests as they move across the globe.
